# ENROLMENT INFORMATION

## Catechism Program for Year 3 & Older

At St Christopher's Parish, it is the usual practice that children receive the Sacraments in the following order:

First Reconciliation - Year 3
First Eucharist - Year 4
Confirmation - Year 6 or older

A child preparing for any Sacrament is required to attend Sunday School beginning Term One each year and achieve at least 80% attendance at Sunday School. Families are to note that the Presentation Mass, Retreat/Preparation Days and Family Evenings in preparation for the Sacraments are all compulsory.



### Sunday School starting 8 February 2015

St Christopher's Sunday School runs from 9.30am to 10.25am every Sunday during school term. All children in Year 3 & older are welcome. An important aspect of Sunday School is the gathering of children in their peer Faith Community where the children learn together with their friends, followed by attendance at the 10.30 am Sunday Mass with Children's Liturgy. Friendships develop amongst the children as they learn and grow together in faith. The Sunday School Team strives to build a partnership between families and the church. Each child will have a Faith Workbook in which he/she has to complete one page per week under the guidance of parents. The aim of Sunday School is NOT merely to prepare the children for the Sacraments. Attendance at Sunday School is expected throughout the year and does not end once the Sacraments have been conferred. What follows is 'Mystagogy' from a Greek word meaning 'learning about the mysteries'. It is essential that the children continue their learning, in order to deepen and grow in their Catholic faith and build a life-long relationship with God.
